Independence Day Fun Facts

- Congress made Independence Day an official <u>unpaid</u> holiday for federal employees in 1870
- ◆ In 1938, Congress made Independence Day a <u>paid</u> federal holiday
- The Declaration of Independence was signed by 56 men from 13 colonies
- Two of the 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence served as President of the United States; John Adams and Thomas Jefferson
- Originally, Benjamin Franklin proposed the turkey as the national bird, but Thomas Jefferson overruled him by recommending the bald eagle as the national bird
- On July 4th of every year, the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia is tapped 13 times in honor of the original 13 colonies
